Philippians Chapter 4: Lesson 25

Before you begin each day:

- 5. "Personal" questions are to share if you wish.

First Day: Read Philippians 4:1-4

- 1. In verse 1, what does the word "therefore" refer to?
- 2. How does Paul describe the Philippians?

- 3. Refer back to Philippians 1:4 and 2:16 and I Thessalonians 2:19-20. How do these verses add meaning to this description?
- 4. Would you use these words to describe fellow believers?

Second Day: Consider Paul's instruction to "stand firm."

1. Who are we to stand firm in?

2. How are we to stand firm? Read Philippians 1:27, Romans 5:2, Ephesians 6:14.

Third Day: Paul describes a situation in verses 2 and 3. Last week we discussed the word "plead" and pleading or imploring others. Do we have the same desire to maintain unity and the same mind within our church? Why would we intervene in disagreements?

Fourth Day: What does it mean to have your name written in the Book of Life? Read Revelation 20:11-15 and 21: 9-27.

Personal and Challenge: What are you doing to encourage others and yourself to stand firm?
